Event Report:

The Department of Bengali at Deshabandhu Mahavidyalaya organized a cultural event to commemorate the death anniversary of Rabindranath Tagore on August 8, 2025. The event was held at 12:30 PM onwards, and Dr. Devlina Chowdhury, Coordinator of the Department, was the person in charge.

The event began with a warm welcome by Dr. Devlina Chowdhury, who set the tone for the celebration. Anjana Gorain, a student of 3rd Semester, Bengali Major, mesmerized the audience with her soulful rendition of "Tomar Asime Pranamana laye". The Honorable Principal, Dr. Tridib Santapa Kundu, inaugurated the event by offering a floral tribute to Tagore's portrait, followed by other dignitaries.

The 'Baishey Shraban Shankhya' of the departmental wall magazine 'Yapam' was also inaugurated. Dr. Kundu delivered a thought-provoking speech on Tagore's life and works, followed by Dr. Abul Hossain, IQAC Coordinator, who shared insightful perspectives on Tagore's life. Bandana Pal, a student of 5th Semester, recited a poignant poem on 22nd Shraban.

The event featured a range of performances, including Dr. Devlina Chowdhury's melodious rendition of "Aj Jyotsnarate Sobai Gechhe Bone", Ankita Pal's dance to Tagore's iconic song "Tumi Ki Keboli Chhobi", and Snigdha Dey's recitation of a powerful poem from Bishnu Dey's "Baishye Shraban". Ms. Samayita Dutta, the college librarian, also shared her poetic tribute to Tagore.

The program concluded with a vote of thanks by Prof. Biplob Chowdhury, Associate Professor of Commerce, and a soul-stirring song by Anjana Gorain, "Jakhan Porbe Na Mor Payer Chinha Ei Bate".
